



- Created by the 2017 Montana Legislature
- Purpose: AIS Prevention, enhancing coordination
- Geographic scope: Upper Columbia Basin
- Membership: 9 voting members appointed by the Governor, ~10 ex-officio federal members
- Coordination, monitoring, education, response
- Meet 4-6 times annually
  - Next meeting: 12/12 in Missoula
    - Funding discussion
    - AIS in the upcoming Legislative session
  - Potential: Monitoring pre-season workshop





Addressing the Threat of Aquatic Invasive Species

Invasive species are one of the most serious environmental threats of the 21st century. Invasive species are defined as "a species that is non-native to the ecosystem under consideration and whose introduction causes or is likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health." Invasive species are also one of the largest threats to biodiversity, cited as second only to habitat destruction as a result of development.


