

## Why an AIS District?


- We have amazing resources to protect

# Why an AIS District?

Provides a vehicle for Missoula County Commission to allocate funding towards AIS in Missoula County.

- Supplemental support of Watercraft Inspection
- Increase enforcement support for AIS offenses
- Support increased survey and monitoring efforts
- Increase education/community prevention efforts
- Provide funding for control efforts



## How did we create it?

### 7-22-2601. Invasive species ordinances.

(1) Subject to subsection (2), counties located within the Columbia River basin may adopt ordinances and resolutions regarding the prevention or control of invasive species, as defined in **80-7-1003**, within the county.
